Working	group	highlights:
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• The Climate Change and Consumer Behaviour working group are planning a second stage workshop, following the expert engagement exercise in May which aimed to map the consumer behaviour trends influenced by climate change concerns (a summary of this work is available here). A second workshop is currently being planned to engage across the FSA to explore possible next steps. • The Assurance working group have commissioned a piece of work to develop a 'good science' quality assurance toolkit to support the production of high-quality research. • The Kitchen Life 2 working group continues to support the research project Kitchen Life 2, where Wave 1 of fieldwork is nearly complete. Initial findings from the pilot and wave 1 will be available in late November. Wave 2 recruitment has also commenced. • The Committee are discussing a new working group to guide the Wider Consumer Interests social research programme.
